

The Band Boosters met on October 4, 2010 at 7:00 p.m. in the choir room. Booster President Jennifer Turner brought the meeting to order.

Standing reports were addressed. The secretary report was asked for. A copy was handed out, so it was not read aloud. Wanda Milby made a motion that we accept the report. Jamie Miller seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The treasurer's report was given by Debbie Zanot. She gave the Sept. report first, then the October report. Upon no further questions or discussion, Wanda Milby made a motion to accept the report. Donna Cherry seconded the motion. The motion passed.

We then moved on to old business.

Uniforms were discussed next. After much discussion on how to make sure uniforms are cleaned and returned by mini-band camp, Jamie Edmondson proposed that \$500 be allocated for cleaning the uniforms and that any additional cost be paid by the parents. Wendy LeDuc seconded the motion. Upon a vote, the motion passed.

Oct. 22nd will be a Practice Under the Lights. On the 22nd, pictures will be taken right after school. (Pictures will not be taken) Forms and money will be due on the day the pictures are made. The forms are in the band room and can also be found on the website. Students will be fed 2 slices of pizza and a drink for \$1. They will be fed at 6:00 and rehearsal will begin at 7:00.

State competition information was discussed next. The band is scheduled to perform on Oct. 30th. There will be a mandatory parent/student meeting on Monday, Oct. 25th. This meeting is mandated by the Tipton County Board of Education for overnight trips. The full itinerary will be presented at the meeting. At least one parent and the student must attend. Departure will be early Oct. 30th and we will return in the afternoon of Oct. 31st. Students MUST attend school on

Mon., Nov. 1st. We will have a home game on Fri., Oct. 29th.

We then moved on to New Business:

Mini-band camp will be on Oct. 15th. It will begin at 8 a.m. Students will be fed lunch for \$1. It will include a hamburger, a hotdog, chips, and a drink. Lunch will be served from 11:30-12:30. We do need volunteers to help.

There are 2 fundraisers currently going on. They are both due Oct. 18th and the delivery date is Nov. 15th. Money is due at the time of order. The fundraisers are the candles (50/50 split) and the butter braid pastries (for \$11). The pastries do come frozen. Donna Cherry made a motion that the pastries fundraiser be a 50/50 split. Teresa Crofts seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Cookbooks will be received in time for the holidays.

Fruit sales will run from Nov. 2nd –17th. This is also a 50/50 split.

Beverly Johnson informed us of the price of the show patches. Wanda Milby made a motion that the boosters pay for the patches for the students and that we order 225. Christy Wilson seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Mr. Trobaugh then addressed the group. He said he was very pleased with the progress over the past week. The Director of Music at UT Martin will be coming to help out. He said that today was the first rehearsal date with everyone here. As far as competitions, this past week at UT Martin was a quality win. West Memphis will not provide as much competition. At the Southaven competition, Desoto Central will be our main competition. Mr. Trobaugh complimented our chaperones. He said to continue staying close to the students. Proximity prevents many problems. The show is still changing. Things are being added all the time.

Jennifer acknowledged Mr. Marshall's support of our band and asked us to thank him when we saw him. She also informed us that he was a finalist in the state Principal of the Year.

Next, Jennifer told us that Aurelia Blaydes father passed away last week. Donations are being taken for that family. If you write a check, make it out to the Band Boosters and write Blaydes family on the memo line.
